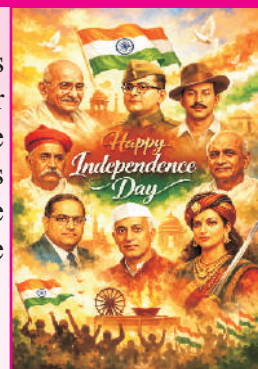
Independence Day

Indian National Anthem was adopted in 1950. The song "Bharoto Bhagyo Bidhata", created by Rabindranath Tagore in 1911, was renamed as "Jana Gana Mana" and approved as the National anthem by the Constituent Assembly of India on January 24, 1950.



Lord Mountbatten chose August 15 as the India's Independence day, although the Indian Independence Act was passed on July 18, 1947.



The first time Indian flag was raised in 1906. The current flag was adopted on July 22 1947, and raised on August 15, 1947, with the 24-spoke Ashok Chakra, with saffron, white and green stripes.



The Indian flag is only manufactured and supplied at one location in India. The Karnataka Khadi Gramodyoga Samyukta Sangha (KKGSS), situated in Dharwad, Karnataka, manufactures and supplies the National Flag of India.

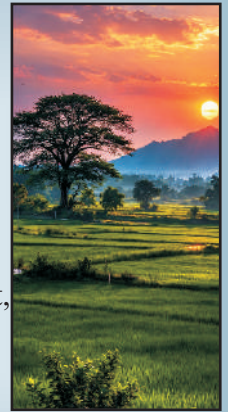

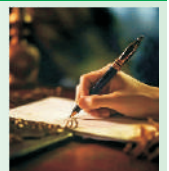
