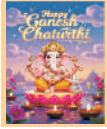

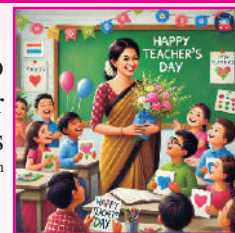

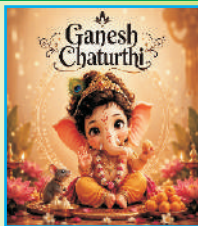

Teachers - The Guiding Lights

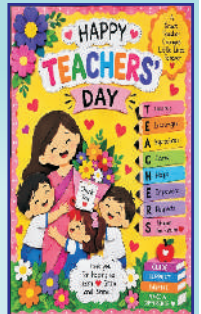

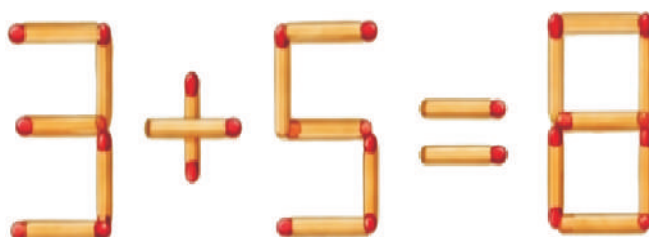
Onam is truly a festival of joy, prosperity and unity. It fills everyone's heart with happiness and reminds us of the importance of living together peacefully.

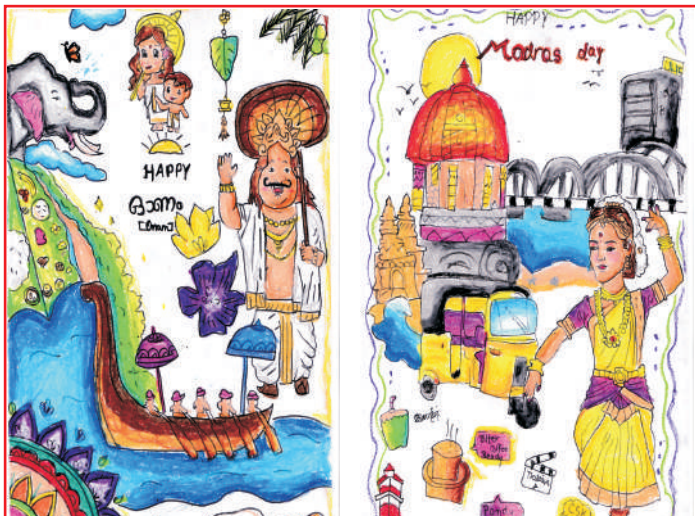
